

2012 LMS ELECTIONS TO COUNCIL AND NOMINATING COMMITTEE

How do I vote in the LMS 2012 Elections?

The Electoral Reform Services (ERS) is administering the 2012 Elections on behalf of The London Mathematical Society. Paper copies of ballot material were sent to all members eligible to vote on 12th October 2012.

This year an online voting option has been introduced and you may now cast your vote either by internet or by post. For both paper and electronic votes, the deadline for the receipt of a vote is midnight on **8th November 2012**.

Voting using an e-ballot

To cast an electronic vote go to www.votebyinternet.com/LMS2012. You will need to enter your personal two part security code, which is printed on page 2 of the ballot paper and was also sent by e-mail on 19th October to members who are registered to receive e-communication from the Society. Complete the e-ballot papers and then press the 'Submit' option.

Voting using a paper ballot.

Complete the ballot paper which was sent to you by the ERS, place the completed ballot paper in the 'secrecy envelope', sign the secrecy envelope, then send the vote to the ERS in the pre-paid envelope.

Votes by paper and votes via the online system are treated in an identical way for generating the results of the election. The ERS system automatically identifies duplicate votes. In the event that a member inadvertently casts two votes, the first vote received (whether by paper or by the e-system) will be counted.

It remains open to members to cast their vote in person at the AGM although all members are strongly encouraged to cast their vote in advance of the AGM by post or electronically.
