ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Annual General Meeting of the London Mathematical Society will be held on Friday, 19 November 1976, in the Geological Society Lecture Room, Burlington House, Piccadilly, London W1V 0NL, at 5 p.m.

The report of the Treasurer will be read. The meeting is empowered by Article 18 of the Statutes of the Society and by By-Law I, 10 of the By-Laws of the Society to elect twenty Members to form a Council and Officers for the ensuing year. The Meeting will also appoint Auditors.

A list of those Members who have been recommended by the present Council (acting under this Article and under By-Laws I, 2, 3, 4) for election as the Council and Officers for 1976-77 is enclosed. *Under By-Law I, 7 you have power to add*

any eligible names that are not already contained in this list. Such names as you do not vote for should be struck out until the whole number, including the Officers, is reduced to twenty; but the list must contain at least two names of Members not on the Council for the session 1975-76. The Officers must include a President, Vice-Presidents, a Treasurer, a Librarian, and a Secretary or Secretaries.

Council shall appoint Editors of the *Proceedings*, *Journal* and *Bulletin* who shall be Members of the Society and shall take charge of these publications under the direction of the Council. Council may appoint one or more Assistant Editors for any of these publications, who shall also be Members of the Society.

SUPPORT FOR CONFERENCES

The scheme for conference support by the London Mathematical Society is to be continued. In general, it is intended that the money shall be used for small conferences, or for small items that cannot be covered by grants from other sources.

Applications for support should include full organisational details of the conference, the proposed budget and available information about the conference programme. Enquiries and applications should be addressed to Professor C. T. C. Wall, Department of Pure Mathematics, Uni-

versity of Liverpool L69 3BX. Applications may be made at any time, but the main allocation of money for the year will probably take place about March.

Last session, applications were received in respect of three conferences: Permutation Groups (Oxford, 7-11 May), Logic Colloquium (Oxford, 19-30 July) and Transformation Groups (Newcastle 4-11 August). In each case a grant of £150 was authorised, and was spent on partial support of participants.

A NOTE FROM THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Last December a conference was organised in Nottingham on "Adapting University Mathematics to current and future educational needs". It was run on participatory lines, and most Universities sent participants representing the different sub-disciplines of Mathematics (Pure, Applied, Statistics, Computing). These indicated enthusiastically that they had found the conference valuable and suggested various possible themes for further conferences. Consultations made at the British Mathematical Colloquium in Aberystwyth at Easter indicated that there was most interest in a conference on the Honours Mathematics curriculum as a whole, and its relationship to the supply of undergraduates. Therefore a "Conference on the Supply of Honours Mathematics Graduates" is planned for December, 1976, and preliminary details have been sent to Heads of Mathematics Departments.

The last conference suggested that such conferences might best be sponsored by the Joint Mathematical Council of the U.K.

since it is composed of representatives of all the principal Mathematical professional organisations in Britain (see *NEWS-LETTER*, April 1975). As a result, the JMC will sponsor the proposed conference and the Organising Committee consists of members of the London Mathematical Society, together with certain individual members of the JMC who are concerned professionally with the training of Mathematics graduates for the Post-graduate Certificate of Education (PGCE). The conference will be concerned with the qualities required by Mathematics graduates in various types of employment.

It is expected that the present Conference will raise many subsidiary questions. The JMC will most probably sponsor discussion of these via *small* groups of interested specialists, later, rather than having conferences with attendance from all University Mathematics Departments. (Already, the Institute of Mathematics and its Applications has held short Conferences on such matters as the Academic/Industry interface.) H. B. GRIFFITHS

OPERATOR ALGEBRAS AND THEIR APPLICATIONS

Under the sponsorship of the International Mathematical Union, the Institute of Mathematics and Mechanics of the Academy of Sciences of the GDR in Berlin, the Department of Mathematics of the Karl Marx University in Leipzig and the Department of Mathematics of the Friedrich Schiller University in Jena are organising an International Conference on Operator Algebras, Ideals, and their Applications in Theoretical Physics. The conference will take place in Leipzig, German Democratic Republic on 11-21 September, 1977.

The programme of the conference will mainly be devoted to the following topics: Topological algebras and their representations, structures of $*$ -algebras, automorphisms of $*$ -algebras and Tomita-Takesaki-theory; Operator ideals on Banach spaces, geometry of Banach spaces, measures on locally convex spaces, classes of locally convex spaces; Algebraic approach to quantum field theory and statistical physics, mathematical scattering theory, non-equilibrium statistical mechanics.
