Thank you for your ongoing support of the London Mathematical Society through your continuing membership. I write to remind you that subscriptions, including payments for periodicals for personal use, for the session November 2016–October 2017 **become due on 1 November 2016**, and should be paid **no later than 1 December 2016** (except for Direct Debits, see below).

#### Access to your membership record online

Members can now access their own records online by logging on to the Society's website: [www.lms.ac.uk/user](http://www.lms.ac.uk/user). A member's record will contain the relevant information about them as held by the Society, including contact details and information about their membership and, where applicable, journal subscriptions. #### Membership Benefits

We are pleased to remind you that your annual subscription entitles you to a range of benefits; use of the Verblunsky Members' Room at De Morgan House, use of the Society's Library at UCL, regular *Newsletters* and e-Updates, networking opportunities and membership of a vibrant international society, among many others including the discounts and free online access to journals, as mentioned below.

#### Paying your subscription:

- *Direct Debit Payments:* The Society encourages members to pay by direct debit. - Please note it is essential the Society is given a current email address if you wish to subscribe to electronic access of any of the above journals.
  - If you take a free electronic subscription to *the Bulletin*, *Journal*, and/or *Proceedings of the LMS*, your email address will be passed to Wiley who will administer access to these journals.
  - If you take a free electronic subscription to *the Nonlinearity*, your email address will be passed to the Institute of Physics who will contact you with details on how to access the journals.

## NOTES

### SUBSCRIPTIONS

1. The basic subscription is exclusive of periodicals.
2. The subscription is not payable by a member who:
  - (i) is an Honorary Member; or
  - (ii) has paid annual subscriptions for not less than 35 years; or
  - (iii) is a representative nominated by an Institutional Member.If you claim free basic subscription please indicate the reason clearly on the subscription form.
3. Concessions are available to members who have returned to full-time education, are on a career break or in part-time working, or are unemployed or otherwise in hardship. Contact [membership@lms.ac.uk](mailto:membership@lms.ac.uk) to enquire further.
4. Members who were elected in 2015 **and** pay their fees by direct debit will be entitled to a 50% discount on the fees for 2016/17 (excluding concessionary membership) as part of the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary membership offer.

### LMS PUBLICATIONS FOR MEMBERS

5. The pricing structure also allow individual members to access *Bulletin*, *Journal*, *Proceedings* of the LMS and *Nonlinearity* online, free of charge. From 1 January 2017, only current subscribers to print copies with online access to these journals, for personal use only, may continue to subscribe at a substantial discount.

Subscriptions to *Bulletin*, *Journal* and *Proceedings* of the LMS are administered by Wiley.

Subscriptions to *Nonlinearity* are administered by the Institute of Physics.

In common with other mathematical societies, the Society regards a subscription as for personal use only if:

- a. issues are either destroyed or held on a continuing basis among the member's personal belongings, and are not deposited even temporarily in a library, common room or other public room, and
- b. issues are accessible to other mathematicians (or to students) only with the member's permission, given individually in each case, and
- c. electronic subscriptions are only for personal use and may not be made accessible to other mathematicians.

Issues are the personal property of members, who would be able, without negotiation with authorities, to take the issues with them if they left their present institution or to give them to another individual who is willing to abide by these terms.

6. The Society reserves the right to discontinue the supply of periodicals to members whose subscriptions remain unpaid by *1 December 2016* (where the subscription arrives after 1 December, then back issues will be supplied but with some delay).

### OTHER PUBLICATIONS AND DISCOUNTS AVAILABLE TO INDIVIDUAL MEMBERS

7. The Society is associated with the publication of three book series:
  - the LMS Student Texts (Cambridge University Press),
