

London Mathematical Society Prizes

In 2021, Council expects to award the Berwick Prize. Brief descriptions of the criteria and eligibility for the Berwick Prize are given below. The formal regulations for this prize can be accessed at <u>tinyurl.com/lmsprizes-regs</u>.

Nominations are made by completing the nomination form (including the 'case for the award' section) on the following pages and returning it by 13th January 2021 to prizes@lms.ac.uk, together with a CV, publications list and copy of the nominated paper. Nominations should be sent by email as a scanned PDF; please note that, owing to Covid-19 restrictions, any nominations sent by post may not be received before the deadline. The scope of the prize includes all aspects of mathematics, and the Council has emphasised that this includes applied mathematics, mathematical physics and mathematical aspects of computer science (except where specified).

Nominations need not describe in detail the candidate's work, as detailed references for those shortlisted will be sought. The 'Case for Award' section of the nomination form should be completed in approximately 500 words and should focus on the nominated paper.

The prize shall only be awarded to mathematicians who on the 1st January of the year of its award are (i) not already Fellows of the Royal Society of London, and (ii) have fewer than 15 years (full time equivalent) of involvement in mathematics at post-doctoral level, allowing for breaks in continuity, or who in the opinion of the Prizes Committee are at an equivalent stage in their career.

Please note that no-one may be awarded the same prize more than once, and that the prize may not be awarded to members of the Council of the Society or to current members of the Prizes Committee. Additional restrictions on eligibility may also apply (see below). Council reserves the right not to make an award of any particular prize in the event that no candidate of sufficient merit is recommended by the Prizes Committee. The Berwick Prize, named after Professor W.E.H. Berwick (Vice President, 1929-30), is awarded in odd-numbered years. It is awarded in recognition of a piece of mathematical research of the highest quality actually published by the Society during the past eight years (i.e. between I January 2013 and 31 December 2020 for the 2021 award).

Eligibility

- The Berwick Prize can be awarded to the author(s) of a definite piece of research of the highest quality that is actually published by the Society.
- The research must be published in any of the following eligible publications:

Bulletin of the London Mathematical Society, Journal of the London Mathematical Society, Proceedings of the London Mathematical Society, Transactions of the London Mathematical Society Journal of Topology, Nonlinearity, LMS Journal of Computation & Mathematics, LMS Lecture Notes, LMS Monographs

• No person shall be awarded the Berwick Prize more than once as either an individual or joint award. The Berwick Prize cannot be awarded to any person who has previously received the Senior Berwick Prize as either an individual or joint award.

Recent winners include C. Barwick (2019), K. Costello (2017), P. E. Caprace and N. Monod (jointly, 2015), J. Chuang and R. Kessar (jointly, 2009), I. G. Gordon (2005).
