

## Application form for the Cecil King Travel Scholarship

### 2019 Award

The London Mathematical Society annually awards a £5000 Cecil King Travel Scholarship in Mathematics, to a young mathematician of outstanding promise. The Scholarship is awarded to support a period of study or research in mathematics abroad, typically for a period of three months.

The award can be made to any outstanding mathematician, whatever their specialist field of mathematical research. This could be pure or applied mathematics. 'Mathematics' is also taken to extend to biological, physical or engineering science areas, provided the research is principally mathematical rather than experimental.

The award is competitive and based on a written proposal describing the intended programme of study or research abroad and the benefits to be gained from such a visit. A shortlist of applicants will be selected for interview. Candidates will be asked to give a brief presentation at the interview stage.

Applicants must be nationals of the UK or the Republic of Ireland, either registered for or having completed a doctoral degree within 12 months of the closing date.

Candidates are asked to provide:

- A completed **application form**
- A **CV**, maximum of two sides of A4, *including research interests and activities*.
- A **short proposal** (three pages maximum). This should describe the proposed programme of study abroad (and the institution to be visited), and the benefit that the visit will bring.
- **Two academic references**
- A **letter of support from the supervisor at the institution where the proposed visit will take place**.

The Cecil King Travel Scholarship was established in 2001 by the Cecil King Memorial Foundation. The award is made by the Council of the London Mathematical Society on the recommendation of the Cecil King Prize Committee, nominated by the Society's Education Committee.

### **Support from the institution where the visit will take place**

In addition to the two academic references, candidates are asked to provide a brief statement from the proposed supervisor where the visit will take place. This statement should confirm

- that they are prepared to receive the visit
- what facilities will be available to the visitor (office space, computer, library, specialist facilities, access to lectures/meetings etc)
- how they feel that the visit would be of benefit to the applicant

This supporting statement ought to be no longer than one side of A4.
