### New/Full Renewal Applications

#### Important Notes

##### Before Completing the Form:

- Please ensure that you have complied with the rules on our website and read the notes below.
- This form should be used for new applications or full renewal applications only.
- The nominated “grant holder”, who will be responsible for the use of the grant, should complete this form.
- Applications must have the support of collaborators from at least two further institutions. Both supporters should have seen the application and agree to participate.
- **For Renewal Applications** - Financial and Academic Reports of the activities for the previous year must be submitted with the application.

##### General Guidelines:

- The Society will support only mathematical activities or the mathematical component of wider activities, and here the word mathematical excludes mathematics education.
- The Society does not like to receive sequential applications for grants to support the same or closely related events, and will not allow its limits for individual schemes to be exceeded by artificially sub-dividing an application into a number of separate requests under different headings.
- Applicants must comply with the Society’s policy on Women in Mathematics - [https://www.lms.ac.uk/sites/lms.ac.uk/files/Mathematics/wim\\_statement.pdf](https://www.lms.ac.uk/sites/lms.ac.uk/files/Mathematics/wim_statement.pdf). The Society considers a lack of uninvited women speakers to be a very real problem, and a failure to include women speakers are grounds for refusal for funding.
- Academic and financial reports of the activities will be required.

##### Assessment Checklist:

Applicants may like to note the following checklist used by the Society when assessing applications:

- Mathematical quality of the project.
- Well-argued proposal, with a clear statement of the mathematical component in the case of a wider project.
- Well thought out and cost-effective budget, with the request restricted to allowable costs, and an appropriate and clearly identified balance of funding from other sources and the registration fee.
- The difference made by the Society’s grant to the viability and success of the project.
- Likely beneficiaries.
- Compliance with the Society’s policy on Women in Mathematics and expectations of those seeking grants.
- Limitation on the number of grants awarded to any individual or department.
- Sufficient time available for publicity of the event.
- Receipt of satisfactory reports on previous grants.

##### Completing the Form:

- Applications should be self-contained; please do not append substantial documents that contain irrelevant detail or refer to websites for key information.
- The form must be countersigned by two supporters, or confirmation (in the form of printouts of emails) must be provided that they have seen the application and agree to participate.
- If none of the applicants is a member of the Society then the application must be countersigned by a member who is prepared to support the application.

##### Academic Case:

- The academic justification for a Scheme 3 grant should focus on the benefit to UK mathematics that the proposed research meetings would bring.

##### Expenditure:

- The maximum award shown on the website is the upper limit, not the standard award.
- No strict criteria will be laid down as to the use of the money but the Society reserves the right to judge whether the activities proposed in an application are appropriate for a grant.
- Any surplus grant must be returned to the Society as soon as possible and may not be used for other purposes.

##### Application Checklist:

- Applications must be signed and if applicable, countersigned by an LMS member.
- Signatures of two supporters or emails of support attached.
- Financial and Academic Report for previous year attached, if applicable.
